#### Early Life & Career

1904	Born in Tokyo, Japan
1917	Learns oil painting at the Nihon Junior High School
1920	Sees exhibition and meets exiled Russian Futurist painter David Burliuk in Tokyo
1929	Learns about the European Avant-Garde - particularly Russian Constructivism and Dadaism
1930	Turns from painting and concentrates on making sculptural works
1938	Takes part in the formation of the 'Zettaishoha-kyokai' ('Non-Objective Society') and the 'Kyushitsu-kai' ('Nine Room Society' – avant-garde group within the Nika Society)
1939	Founding member of the 'Art Culture Association' consisting of Surrealist artists

1982	Becomes a lecturer and in 1985, headmaster, Tokyo School of Arts
1964-73	professor at Tama Art University
